ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER No. 2003 -01

Reviewing Cases of Children Absent Without Legal Permission

IT IS ORDERED:

Pursuant to Michigan Supreme Court Administrative Order 2002-04, and in order to establish a plan for review of cases involving children who are absent from court-ordered placements without legal permission, and protect wards of the 10th Circuit Court-Family Division.

- 1. Hon. Faye M. Harrison, presiding judge of the family division, is responsible for supervision of the plan and on-going efforts to locate children absent without legal permission (AWOLP).
- 2. Cases of children absent without legal permission will receive priority from the family division, particularly for those children under 16 years of age and for children who may have been abducted. The Court and Saginaw County Family Independence Agency have conducted an initial inventory regarding children from Saginaw County who are AWOLP and will continue to monitor and update the status of any wards deemed to be AWOLP.
- 3. Judge Harrison's clerk will maintain the list of any children from Saginaw County who are identified as AWOLP and will keep Judge Harrison advised of information concerning those children on a weekly basis, whether that information is received from the Family Independence Agency, law enforcement, the Supreme Court Administrative Office, or other source.
- 4. The Saginaw County Family Independence Agency will notify the judge's clerk of any child who is absent without legal permission by filing the "Unauthorized Leave Report to the Court/Law Enforcement" (FIA 3198A) or similar document with the clerk within 24 hours/1 business day after the child is identified as AWOLP; and by any other method of notification agreed upon between the Court and the Director of the Saginaw County FIA office. It is anticipated that this will involve electronic as well as hard copy notice by the supervisors specifically designated by FIA to perform this function.
- 5. The court will issue an Order to Take/Place into Temporary Custody when the court is notified that a Saginaw County child is absent without legal permission .

- 6. The court will schedule a hearing or a case status conference to ascertain steps that may be taken to locate and appropriately place the child. At the hearing or case status conference, the court will:
- A. determine persons of interest who may have information to aid in locating the missing child,
 - B. make decisions regarding actions to be taken to locate the missing child,
- C. determine the appropriate actions to be taken when the missing child has been located.
- 7. A status conference will be scheduled within seven days of notification to the Court that a child is AWOLP. Hearings will be scheduled as needed, insuring at least seven days notice to interested persons. Judge Harrison's clerk will provide the judge weekly with the available information for each Saginaw County child listed as AWOLP. Should the judge be unavailable for any reason, information will be provided to the senior family division referee for action consistent with this administrative order.
- 8. In its discretion, the Court may use informal measures to locate, communicate with and ensure proper placement of an AWOLP child, and in all cases, the Court will utilize all statutory and court rule authority to locate and expedite return of the AWOLP child to proper placement. The Court will offer assistance consistent with this plan to the Saginaw County and Michigan Family Independence Agencies in locating AWOLP children even if the child involved is not a current ward of the 10th Circuit Court Family Division so long as this does not duplicate efforts of another court within this state.
- 9. Because of the high priority accorded to these cases, Judge Harrison will personally monitor and report on the status of children absent without legal permission. Reports will be updated as circumstances indicate and will be provided to the State Court Administrative Office and the Chief Circuit Judge.
- 10. No special problems have been identified to delay implementation of this order. Judge Harrison will confer regularly with the director of the Saginaw County Family Independence Agency to identify and remedy systemic problems as they arise. Any special problems that may appear in a particular case will be dealt with through the status conference and hearing process.
