Re: Resolution to Opt Out of PA 152

Dear Chairman Boyd:

Attached for the consideration of the Board of Commissioners is a draft resolution exempting the County from the requirements of Public Act 152 of 2011 (PA 152 of 2011). PA 152 of 2011, known as the Publicly Funded Health Insurance Contributions Act, is intended to limit a public employer's expenditures for employee medical benefit plans, to provide the power and duties of certain state agencies and officials, and to provide for exceptions and for sanctions.

Under the provisions of PA 152 of 2011, public employers in the State of Michigan are required to adopt by January 1 of each new year, provisions providing for compliance with its requirements. In the 2022, 2023 and 2024 medical benefit plan coverage years, the County Board of Commissioners adopted resolutions exempting itself from the requirements of PA 152 of 2011. In order to extend this exemption, the Board must approve doing so by a 2/3 vote, prior to the beginning of each succeeding medical benefits plan year. Approval of the resolution will allow for the exemption to be extended to the 2025 medical benefit plan coverage year.

The Board, in approving last year's resolution acknowledged its responsibility to revisit its options and responsibilities under PA 152 of 2011 on an annual basis. I am hereby requesting the Board of Commissioners adopt the attached Resolution to exempt the County from the requirements of PA 152 of 2011 for the 2025 medical benefit plan coverage year.

WHEREAS,	the Act contains three options for complying with the requirements of the A	Act;

- **WHEREAS,** the three options are as follows:
 - Section 3 "Hard Caps" Option limits a public employer's total annual health care costs for employees based on coverage levels, as defined in the Act;
 - 2) Section 4 "80% / 20%" Option limits a public employer's share of total annual health care costs to not more than 80%. This option requires an annual majority vote of the governing body;
 - 3) Section 8 "Exemption" Option a local unit of government, as defined in the Act, may exempt itself from the requirements of the Act by an annual 2/3 vote of the governing body;

WHEREAS, the Saginaw County Board of Commissioners has decided to adopt the annual Exemption option as its choice of compliance under the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of the County of Saginaw, Michigan elects to comply with the requirements of 2011 Public Act 152, the Publicly Funded Health Insurance Contribution Act, by adopting the annual Exemption option and exempting itself from the requirements of the Act for the medical plan benefit coverage year January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025.
