Emergency Management is continuing a multiyear project with the goal of putting a Stop the Bleed Kit in every school classroom in Saginaw County. Thus far, this project has been supported by Homeland Security Grants, the Marine Corps League – John C. Rock Detachment, the 100 Club of Saginaw (twice), the Fordney Club of Saginaw County (twice), Covenant Healthcare, Meijer, United Way of Saginaw, and Commissioner Chris Boyd. Currently, kits supplied to



schools are just over 700. We still have some work to do with an estimated need of about 1,000 more kits. If you want to know more about this project and the Stop the Bleed Program, go to <u>www.saginawcounty.com/emhsd</u>.

Along with MBS Airport and other public safety and healthcare facilities in Saginaw, Bay, and Midland Counties, Emergency Management coordinated and participated in a full-scale exercise at MBS Airport. Exercises such as this allow



participating agencies to evaluate plans and practice response procedures for high-impact, low-occurrence events. While we hope never to put these plans into place, rest assured that public safety and healthcare in the area stand ready to respond to any disaster, large or small.

Summer is here and the hundred-degree days are upon us! But the planes are flying, and the airport is busy!

Statistics show arrivals and departures at KHYX are up 144% compared to the same period two years ago, in 2023!

Spring mosquito control operations were a big success with no major problems this year. But the airport did have some issues with runway lighting recently, and these were fixed with some new electronics.

Fuel prices are: 100 Low Lead fuel at \$5.65 per gallon (self-serve), Jet A fuel at \$5.90 (self-serve, per gallon), and \$7 per gallon full-serve from the fuel truck. Hangars remain at 100% full capacity.

Revenue for Great Lakes Bay hotels increased 8.4% compared to the year prior in April, reaching \$9.4M for the month. This was due to increased demand, which rose 10.3% compared to April 2024. ADR, by contrast, fell 1.8% YoY, to \$118 for the month.

Due to the increase in demand, occupancy rose 10.4% YoY in April, as supply did not expand compared to the year prior. This represented an occupancy rate of 53.3%, and contributed to higher RevPAR, which reached \$62.86 for the month. This was 8.4% higher than in April 2024. Bay County saw the greatest demand growth, with 15.2% higher volumes than the year prior, while Midland County saw declines of 6.3% YoY.

Social Media impressions and engagements were up dramatically from the year prior in April, due to the utilization of paid social advertising which allowed posts to reach a much wider audience.

Paid social also helped to drive traffic to gogreat.com, with 68.8% of social media traffic to gogreat.com originating from a paid source, up from 33.8% the year before. Total visits to gogreat.com from social media (both paid and unpaid) also increased, from 3.6% to 7.4%.

With Easter shifting into April this year (from March in 2024) travel activity increased in several areas. U.S. hotel performance stayed steady in April, with RevPAR down just -0.1% (up +1.6% YTD). International arrivals (excl. land travel from Canada, Mexico) were up 8% versus last year, though still slightly down YTD (0.2%) according to NTTO.

U.S. hourly earnings grew by +3.8% in April, outperforming inflation (+2.3%). Despite a nominal increase in disposable income, consumer sentiment continues to fall amid economic and geopolitical uncertainty. Overall hotel demand rose for April YTD (+0.4%), but economy and independent hotels saw a drop (-1.6% each).

Since 2020, cybercriminals have sent several types of scams related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Many of these scams exploit fears about the pandemic to trick people into acting impulsively. These scams may appear to come from trusted organizations and may seem to contain important health information. Cybercriminals may try to trick you with several different COVID-19 scams. To learn about some of these COVID-19 scams, see the list below:



- Some emails may appear to come from legitimate health organizations, such as the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) or the World Health Organization (WHO). Cybercriminals have spoofed these legitimate organizations to send emails that contain malicious phishing links or dangerous attachments.
- Some emails may ask for charity donations for doctors or victims that have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Cybercriminals often create fake charity emails after global crises occur, such as natural disasters or pandemics.
- Some emails may claim to have a "new" or "updated" list of COVID-19 cases in your area. These emails are often designed to scare you into clicking a malicious link.

Keep in mind, these are only a few examples of potential scams. Cybercriminals constantly come up with new scams to trick you.

Tips to Stay Safe

Don't fall for these scams! Follow the tips below to stay safe:

- Never click on links or download attachments from an email that you weren't expecting.
- If you receive a suspicious email that appears to come from an official organization such as the CDC or the WHO, report the email to the official organization through their website.
- If you want to make a charity donation, go to the charity's official website to submit your payment. Enter the charity's web address into your browser instead of clicking links in emails or other messages.

CrisisConnect reaches Saginaw County law enforcement agencies

In an effort to connect law enforcement to our crisis response teams, SCCMHA has presented the CrisisConnect program to law enforcement agencies in Saginaw County.

Following April's countywide law enforcement training, SCCMHA used that as a kickoff to roll out CrisisConnect, a packaged kit of resources created to give officers tools to help Saginaw County citizens in a behavioral health crisis.

These kits consist of iPhones and iPads with preloaded contact information and apps to connect to SCCMHA's Crisis Intervention Services (CIS), Mobile Response & Stabilization Services (MRSS), a resource guide, and language services. In addition, the kits also have business cards with a dedicated law enforcement phone line, a tear-off notepad with the information for other county resources, and other helpful tools for officers in the field.
