- **Purpose:** The Saginaw County Community Action Committee, Inc., known as the CAC, is the Community Action Agency (CAA) for Saginaw County operating a multi-purpose center. CAA's, defined in both state and federal law, are formed by local communities to address the barriers to self-sufficiency encountered by low income citizens. CAA's bring together local citizens, including low-income persons, to provide the community with a voice regarding the opportunities that will best help to provide self-sufficiency and productivity for the individual and the community. The CAC is a local decision maker, linking community residents, the systematic assessment of local needs, community-wide response, and service delivery.

- **Membership**: The Board consists of fifteen members. One-third (five) members shall be from the public sector, one-third (five) members from the private sector and one-third (five) members are representatives of the poor. The five public sector members generally consist of one representative from the City of Saginaw, one from the Board of Commissioners and three from the highest populated low income areas in the county.
