A message from Parks Director Brian Keenan-Lechel:



Spring has sprung (almost/maybe/ is starting to/started then stopped)! Regardless of weather, the renowned

"Saginaw Bunnies" will adorn the Courthouse lawn again soon for a few weeks around Easter, a sure sign of spring in Saginaw. I began last newsletter asking mother nature to cooperate and deliver a more traditional Michigan winter so that those interested in participating in our snowman/sculpting submission contest had the snow to make it happen. And also, for the winter enthusiasts like me who enjoy various winter recreation offerings – ice fishing in my case, among others. Mother Nature delivered on the ice front, giving the region the longest ice fishing season in the last few years – what an unbelievable resource we are fortunate to have in the Saginaw River/Bay, a worldclass fishery.

Although winter provided more snow than in recent years, its "packability" (official parks term for snowman construction) was less than ideal for snowman/ fort construction. This said, we did receive a few submissions to the build contest during the thaw, highlights are included on this page. The snowfall also provided for happy youth and adults alike, sledding at Saginaw's Hoyt Park and in other areas across the county. This included on Saturday February 15th at Hoyt Park, when Saginaw's Outhouse Races descended on the park with images fit for a snow globe. Almost a thousand folks flocked to the park to

enjoy the winter wonderland. A production company even came to film the spectacle, and we wait to hear if the program will air on ESPN later this year. An eventful winter, no doubt, but an exciting spring and summer just around the corner. We cannot wait to see you again in your Saginaw County Parks – whether exploring trails on your own or registering for one of our guided hikes. Counting bunnies on the courthouse lawn in late April or checking out the spring bird migration at Saginaw River Headwaters Rec Area. Rules

This Family Catch and Release Fishing Festival begins at 8:00 am and ends at 11:00 am on June 7, 2025. Registration deadline is 9:00 am on June 7, 2025. *FISH MUST BE BROUGHT TO THE MEASURING STATION BY 10:45AM TO COUNT.*

Adults with a valid Michigan fishing license and children can fish and have fish counted in the festival. Trophies will be awarded for the family who catches the largest fish and the most legal sized fish. Additional giveaways will be given out to event participants.

All State of Michigan fishing rules and regulations will apply to this tournament. MAX 25 BLUEGILLS. ONLY LEGAL SIZE FISH WILL COUNT. Pike under 24 inches, Catfish under 12 inches, and Bass under 14 inches can not be counted in the tournament (DNR FISHING REGULATIONS). All fishing is to be done from shore or dock on the main lake. Boats are not allowed.

If you can't get the hook out without damaging the fish, cut the line and leave the hook in the fish.

Transport fish to measuring station in a bucket with water. FISH MUST BE ALIVE WHEN BROUGHT TO THE MEASURING STATION. The fish will be released back into the lake as soon as they are measured.


We will begin accepting 2025 pavilion reservations for the William H. Haithco Recreation Area, Imerman Memorial Park, and Price Nature Center on January 2, 2025. Pavilion rental fees are \$75 per day for Saginaw County Residents. Park entry for Saginaw County Residents is free. Non Residents pay a \$2.00 per vehicle entry fee at Imerman Memorial Park and a \$5.00 per vehicle entry fee at the William H. Haithco Recreation Area (Memorial Day weekend thru Labor Day).

New for the 2025 season, reservations & payment may be completed online at www.saginawcounty. com/parks. Please call our office if you need assistance with this new method or need to pay by cash or check.



To get free entry to our parks, Saginaw County Residents can pick up a free Recreate Pass at Imerman Memorial Park, Wm. H. Haithco Recre-

ation Area or the Parks office. Out of county patrons may purchase a \$30 yearly pass for a whole summer of fun!



Just a friendly reminder that dogs are permitted on a 6 ft leash at all of our county parks except the Wm. H. Haithco Recreation Area*. Imerman Memorial Park has a Dog Park where dogs are allowed off leash to romp and play with their friends. Thank you for your cooperation. *Dogs are allowed at Haithco during our Saginaw County Parks sanctioned Soggy Doggy events in the spring and fall.
