FOR THE ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, AUGUST 6, 2024  
To the Qualified Electors of Saginaw County**

**PLEASE TAKE NOTICE** that any qualified elector of Saginaw County who is not already registered, may register to vote at the office of the Township or City Clerk; the Office of the appropriate County Clerk; a Secretary of State branch office, or other designated state agency. **Michigan residents with a valid Michigan driver's license or State ID can register online using the Michigan Online Voter Registration System at <https://mvlc.sos.state.mi.us/>** Registration forms can also be obtained at <https://mvlc.sos.state.mi.us/> and mailed to the Township or City Clerk. Voters who are already registered may update their registration at <https://mvlc.sos.state.mi.us/>.

The last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk is Monday, July 22, 2024.

After this date, anyone who qualifies as an elector may register to vote in person with proof of residency (MCL 168.492) at their respective Township or City Clerk's office (listed below) at the following times:

- Saturday, August 3, 2024, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

CONGRESSIONAL: US Senator, Representatives in Congress – LEGISLATIVE: State Representatives – COUNTY: Prosecutor, Sheriff, Clerk, Treasurer, Register of Deeds, Public Works Commissioner, County Commissioners – TOWNSHIP: Supervisor, Clerk, Treasurer, Trustees, Park Commissioners – TO ELECT DELEGATES: Precinct Delegates in all County Precincts and other such offices as may be elected at that time.

**PLEASE TAKE NOTICE** that the following proposals will appear on the ballot:

**Saginaw County Proposal 24-1 Road Millage New Proposal** - "For the purpose of funding the repair, re-build and restore existing county roads within the townships, and streets within the cities and villages of Saginaw County as required by Chapter 224 of the General Highway Law of the State of Michigan, shall the County of Saginaw increase in the limitation of the total amount of general ad-valorem taxes which may be imposed for all purposes upon all taxable real and personal property in the County as authorized by Article 9, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963, as amended, and levy up to 2.0 Mill (\$2.00 per \$1,000)

of taxable valuation on such property as finally equalized during the years 2024-2029, both inclusive, which is approved and levied in its entirety and estimated to raise \$12,402,124 in the first year.?"

**Saginaw County Proposal 24-2 Commission on Aging – Senior Citizens Extra Voted Millage Renewal and Increase Proposal** - "For the purpose of continuing the operation of the Saginaw County Commission on Aging within the County, shall the County of Saginaw, Michigan ("County") RENEW the previously approved extra millage, which last resulted in a levy of .59 mill (\$0.59 per \$1,000.00) of taxable valuation of such property as finally equalized, and INCREASE the millage limitation on the total amount of general ad valorem taxes, which may be imposed for all purposes upon real and personal property in the County, as provided in Article 9 Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963, as amended, which will result in a total levy of up to .69 mill (\$0.69 per \$1,000.00) of taxable valuation of such property in the years 2025 to 2030, both inclusive, which renewal and increase is estimated to raise up to \$4,547,105 in the first year?"

**Saginaw County Proposal 24-3 Saginaw Children's Zoo Millage Renewal Proposal** - "For the purpose of continuing the operation and maintenance of the Saginaw Children's Zoo by the Saginaw Valley Zoological Society, shall the County of Saginaw, Michigan ("County") renew the previously authorized additional millage in the limitation on the total amount of general ad valorem taxes which may be imposed for all purposes upon real and personal property in the County, as provided in Article 9, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963, as amended, which last resulted in a levy of up to 0.2 Mill (\$0.20 per \$1,000) of taxable valuation of such property as finally equalized, for levy in the years 2025 -2034, both inclusive, which levy is estimated to raise up to \$1,320,534 in the first year?"

**City of Saginaw Proposal 2 Saginaw Transit Authority Regional Services Millage Proposal** - Shall Saginaw Transit Authority Regional Services renew the existing millage of 3.2 mills (\$3.20 per \$1,000 of taxable value) against all taxable property within the City of Saginaw and levy it for five (5) years, 2026 through 2030 inclusive, for the purpose of operations to provide public transportation, which levy would collect an estimated \$1,818,675 in the first year the millage is levied.

**Albee Township Road Maintenance Millage Renewal Proposal** - Shall the millage for Albee Township, Saginaw County Michigan, of one (1) mill (\$1.00 per one thousand dollars), to provide funds for road maintenance and repair within the Township, which exceeds the 15-mill limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of Michigan Constitution on General Ad Valorem Taxes within Albee Township, be renewed at the one (1) mill rate for an additional ten years, 2024 through 2033 inclusive, which levy will raise in the first year of the levy the estimated sum of \$75,709.25.

**Albee Township Road Maintenance Millage Increase Proposal** - Shall the millage for Albee Township, Saginaw County Michigan, of one (1) mill (\$1.00 per one thousand dollars), to provide funds for road maintenance and repair within the Township, which exceeds the 15-mill limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of Michigan Constitution on General Ad Valorem Taxes within Albee Township, be increased by three-fourths (3/4) of one mill for a total mill rate of one-and-three-fourths (1 3/4) mills for an additional ten years, 2024 through 2033 inclusive, which levy will raise in the first year of the levy the estimated sum of \$56,781.94.

**Blumfield Township Road Maintenance Millage Renewal Proposal** - Shall the previously voted increase in tax limitation for 2.0 mills (\$2.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) upon the total amount of general ad valorem taxes imposed upon real and personal property for all purposes in any one year, which exceeds the 15-mill limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution, be renewed for Blumfield Township, Saginaw County, Michigan at the original voted 2.0 mills (\$2.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levied for five years, 2024 through 2028, inclusive, for road maintenance and repair, raising an estimated \$ 233,794.00 in the first year the millage is levied?

**Bridgeport Charter Township Fire Services and Equipment Replacement Proposal** - Shall Bridgeport Charter Township be authorized to raise money for the purpose of providing fire protection and purchasing and maintaining fire vehicles, equipment, and housing, on an annual basis, within the Township by special assessment on benefitting lands and premises as permitted under Act 33 of 1951, which assessment is expected to raise \$396,245.00 in its first year, representing an assessment of \$95.00 dollars per non-vacant parcel within the Township?

**Marion Township Millage Renewal for Fire Protection** - Shall the expired previous voted increase in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution in Marion Township, of 2 mills (\$2.00 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) reduced to 1.8809 mills (\$1.8809 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) by the required millage rollbacks, be renewed at 1.8809 mills (\$1.8809 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) and levied for ten years, 2025 through 2034, inclusive, for operating, maintaining, and equipping the Marion Township Fire Department, raising an estimated \$45,769.00 in the first year the millage is levied.

**Marion Township Millage Renewal for Construction and Improvement of Bridges and Roads** - Shall the expired previous voted increase in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution in Marion Township, of 3 mills (\$3.00 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) reduced to 2.8993 mills (\$2.8993 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) by the required millage rollbacks, be renewed at 2.8993 mills (\$2.8993 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) and levied for ten years, 2025 through 2034, inclusive, for the construction and improvement of bridges and roads within the township, raising an estimated \$70,396.00 in the first year the millage is levied.

**Chesaning Union Schools Bond Proposal** - Shall Chesaning Union Schools, Saginaw and Shiawassee Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Fourteen Million Dollars (\$14,000,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, in one or more series, for the purpose of: remodeling school buildings, including heating, ventilating, and air conditioning improvements and a pool facility; erecting an addition to a school support building; and developing and improving athletic fields and facilities, driveways, parking areas, sidewalks and sites? The following is for informational purposes only: The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2024 is 0.59 mill (\$0.59 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), for a 0 mill net increase over the prior year's levy. The maximum number of years the bonds of any series may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is twenty-five (25) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 1.64 mills (\$1.64 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation). The school district does not expect to borrow from the State to pay debt service on the bonds. The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$17,830,000. The total amount of qualified loans currently outstanding is \$0. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances. (Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited and the proceeds cannot be used for repair or maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or employee salaries, or other operating expenses.)

**I. Frankenmuth School District Operating Millage Proposal** - This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its full revenue per pupil foundation allowance and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963. Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Frankenmuth School District, Saginaw and Tuscola Counties, Michigan, be renewed by 18.1138 mills (\$18.1138 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 6 years, 2025 to 2030, inclusive, and also be increased by .5 mill (\$0.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 6 years, 2025 to 2030, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2025 is approximately \$3,717,552 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2024 levy and the addition of millage which will be levied only to the extent necessary to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?

**II. Frankenmuth School District Sinking Fund Millage Renewal Proposal** - This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the building and site sinking fund millage that expires with the 2024 tax levy. Shall the currently authorized millage rate of 1.9964 mills (\$1.9964 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) which may be assessed against all property in Frankenmuth School District, Saginaw and Tuscola Counties, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 6 years, 2025 to 2030, inclusive, to continue to provide for a sinking fund for the purchase of real estate for sites for, and the construction or repair of, school buildings, and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2025 is approximately \$1,212,977 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2024 tax levy)?

**Hemlock Public School District Operating Millage Renewal Proposal** - This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance and renews millage that will expire with the 2024 tax levy. Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of 18.0614 mills (\$18.0614 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Hemlock Public School District, Saginaw and Midland Counties, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 2 years, 2025 and 2026, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2025 is approximately \$2,621,381 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2024 tax levy)?

**Clinton County Regional Education Service Agency Special Education Millage Proposal** - This proposal will allow the intermediate school district to continue to levy the special education millage previously approved by the electors and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of .2605 mill (\$0.2605 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Clinton County Regional Education Service Agency, Michigan, to provide funds for the education of students with a disability, be renewed for a period of 20 years, 2025 to 2044, inclusive, and also be increased by .0517 mill (\$0.0517 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 20 years, 2025 to 2044, inclusive; the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2025 is approximately \$873,448 from local property taxes authorized herein (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2024 tax levy and a restoration of millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963)?

**Public Libraries of Saginaw Library Millage Renewal Proposal** - Shall the Public Libraries of Saginaw, County of Saginaw, be authorized to levy annually a renewal of the previously authorized millage, which expires in 2024, in an amount not to exceed 1.2983 mills (\$1.2983 on each \$1,000 of taxable value) against all taxable property within the Public Libraries of Saginaw District for a period of ten (10) years, 2025 to 2034, inclusive, for the purpose of providing funds for all district library purposes authorized by law? The estimate of the revenue the District Library will collect in the first year of levy (2025) if the millage is approved and levied by the District Library is approximately \$1,016,000. By law, a portion of the revenue from the millage may be subject to capture by the Brownfield Redevelopment Authorities of Saginaw County and the City of Saginaw and the Saginaw County Land Bank Fast Track Authority.

**All Saginaw County qualified electors have the right to mark a ballot and deposit the ballot in the County Early Vote Center tabulator beginning the second Saturday before an election and ending the Sunday before the election from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and on the Wednesday prior to the election from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. The Saginaw County Early Voting Center is located at 618 Cass St. Saginaw, MI 48602 and is open to all qualified electors within Saginaw County.**
