A YEAR LIKE NO OTHER


The Saginaw County Commission on Aging, like many businesses and organizations throughout the County, have faced unprecedented times. The COVID-19 pandemic has changed the way we deliver services to older adults in Saginaw County. We had to re-think our agency's programs and delivery of services and none of this would have been possible without the hard work and dedication from our incredible staff and volunteers. Since March 26, 2020 when all County facilities closed to the public, the agency has continued to provide supportive services to Saginaw County residents. This includes transportation to medical appointments and grocery trip shopping, meals on wheels and the new curbside meal pick up program. Caseworkers assisted seniors remotely and staff that were unable to work remotely, without hesitation, assisted with packaging and delivery of meals for the nutrition program. The unity and collaborative efforts from our staff is what enabled our agency to continue to serve our most vulnerable residents. In addition, partnerships with other organizations and support from the

County ensured best practices with delivery of services and that our agency had adequate resources to serve older adults safely. Partners include: Region VII Area Agency on Aging, the Saginaw Community Foundation, United Way of Saginaw, Saginaw Transit Authority Regional Services (STARS), the Saginaw County Health Department, Sheriff Department and Emergency Management Department. While it has been a difficult year, our community has collectively worked together to ensure needs are met and services continue and that is something we should all be proud of.







OTHER AGENCY HIGHLIGHTS

- Sheriff Department delivered 8000+ meals!
- Virtual Caregiver/Kinship Support Group Services
- Curbside pickup of incontinence supplies and other needs.
- Census 2020 outreach, promotion and assistance.
- 100 Senior Project Fresh Coupons distributed curbside or by porch drop off.
- Kinship program backpack and school supplies distribution.
- The Marie E. Davis building received a new roof & ADA ramp.
- Received an additional \$141,452 in federal COVID relief funding through FFCRA and \$92,582 through CARES Act funding.
- Received \$96,000 in grant funds from the Meals on Wheels Association of America COVID-19 Relief Fund. With the funding we were able to purchase two new vehicles for the meals on wheels program.
- Facemask distribution to homebound seniors (supported by Region VII Area Agency on Aging) supplied 780 seniors with a 5-pack of cloth masks.
- Transportation drivers, with the lift accessible vans, assisted with the evacuation of 40 residents at St. Francis nursing home the evening of May 19, 2020 when the Edenville/Sanford Lake Dams collapsed.
- Foster Grandparent Program received an additional \$15,000 grant augmentation to support the implementation of technology and other needs to continue to allow volunteers to serve in a virtual capacity with the schools.
- Foresters Financial provided a \$2,000 grant to assemble and distribute Care Packages to our most in need clients. Clients received a bag full of essential household items in December 2020.
- In collaboration with Region VII Area Agency on Aging, hosted two drive through flu clinics at our Eleanor Frank Senior Center and Maple Grove Senior Center.
