Happy New Year from Saginaw County Parks! I sincerely hope your holiday season has been restful and enjoyable, with time spent with family and loved ones, and hopefully some time outside recreating, too. Saginaw County Parks has another exciting



year planned for 2025, kicking things off with the return of our snowman or sculpture contest running through March! Capture a photo or two of your creations and tag us on Facebook or send us an email to participate. Mother Nature, we're counting on you to cooperate for this contest, and for many Michigan winter activity reasons for that matter; including my love of ice fishing so eloquently captured by our Event Coordinator in the top left corner:-)

NEW in 2025 – pavilion reservations can now be made online through the parks website. Additional details on pavilion reservations are in the back of the newsletter, and simply follow the pavilion rental prompts on our website to reserve a pavilion in your beautiful Saginaw County Parks. We're always available to assist and answer questions, so please feel free to give us a call or stop in as well.

2025 will be exciting for many reasons, including Saginaw County Parks kicking off three capital development projects. Imerman Memorial Park will see an accessible family bathroom addition to our restrooms, paved pathways to all park amenities, the renovation of the existing boat launch, and the addition of a separate canoe/kayak launch on the Tittabawassee River. Second, a new trailhead on the south end of the BayZil Trail in Zilwaukee Town-

ship will also break ground. And the third capital improvement project, renovations of the oldest sections of the Saginaw Valley Rail Trail will begin in 2025. The project area for the SVRT enhancements is Lumberjack Park in St. Charles to Swan Creek Rd, featuring bridge deck replacements, new benches and signage, and asphalt repairs/repaving along the way. Both trail projects are funded in part through grants from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund, and the Imerman improvements through an ARPA allocation from the Saginaw County Board of Commissioners. All three are exciting projects further enhancing your Saginaw County Parks and recreational opportunities for Saginaw County residents.

2025 Summer Employment Opportunities

Booth Attendant (6) - \$14/hour. Greets public upon entering the parks, collects fees, answers questions and maintains financial data. Requires good mathematical skills and strong customer service skills. (20-40 hours per week).

Lifeguard (12) - \$14.50/hour (LGI – \$15/hour). Provides a safe and clean aquatic facility. Enforces rules, assists park patrons, operates boat rental and responds to emergency situations. Applicants must be a certified American Red Cross Lifeguard. (20-40 hours per week).

Office Clerk (1) - \$14/hour. Performs general office duties including typing, making copies, answering telephones, filing, etc. Also interacts with customers and conducts cash transactions for reservations and programs. Must be familiar with computer word processing and be able to operate common office equipment. Requires high school diploma or its equivalent (20-40 hours per week).

Park Ranger (8) - \$15/hour. Provides safety, comfort, and convenience for park users. Enforces rules, cleans parks and performs light maintenance duties. Must be 18 or older and requires a valid Michigan driver's license with good driving record. (30-40 hours per week).

Park Supervisor (2) - \$19/hour (Rate negotiable). Supervises staff and assists with the management of county parks. Interacts with the public on a daily basis, enforcing rules and policies. Requires valid Michigan driver's license with good driving record, high school diploma (or equivalent). College graduate preferred with supervisory and aquatics experience. Applicants must be a certified American Red Cross Lifeguard. (30-50 hours per week).

Program Coordinator (2) - \$15/hour (Rate negotiable). Facilitate, promote and evaluate summer Playdate programs as well as leagues, tournaments, youth, and family events at Hoyt Park. Program experience and high school diploma (or equivalent) required. Flexible schedule (15-30 hours per week).

All individuals selected for positions are subject to, and must successfully pass a post offer pre-employment physical, criminal background check and drug screening. All applicants will be required to attend training sessions before working, including American Red Cross First Aid and CPR courses.

Are you looking for a location for your special outing? We have the perfect place for any occasion! Pavilion reservations are ideal for company picnics, family or school reunions, graduation parties, birthday parties, church groups, clubs and any group that would appreciate having their outing in a beautiful Saginaw County Park. The William H. Haithco Recreation Area provides modern bathrooms, playgrounds, Ruth Averill Splash Pad, fishing docks, volleyball courts and five picnic pavilions. Imerman Memorial Park provides modern bathrooms, a fishing dock, a volleyball court, a playground, horseshoe pits, basketball and tennis courts, an in-line hockey rink, Bark Park and four picnic pavilions.

We will begin accepting 2025 pavilion reservations for the William H. Haithco Recreation Area, Imerman Memorial Park, and Price Nature Center on January 2, 2025.

Pavilion rental fees are \$75 per day for Saginaw County Residents. Park entry for Saginaw County Residents is free. Non Residents pay a \$2.00 per vehicle entry fee at Imerman Memorial Park and a \$5.00 per vehicle entry fee at the William H. Haith-co Recreation Area (Memorial Day weekend thru Labor Day).

New for the 2025 season, reservations & payment may be completed online at www.saginawcounty. com/parks. Please call our office if you need assistance with this new method or need to pay by cash or check.
